Educator's Overview of Scavenger Hunt

Kiewit Luminarium has five main galleries, each focused on a different area of exploration:

- Catch Waves
- Dig Deeper
- The Grid
- Find Yourself
- Make It Count

There are also two Luminarium stations with demonstrations every half hour, and themed activities in the Maker Space.

As the educator, you might want to choose one or two themes from the list below, or discuss a few themes with the class and narrow the choices as a group. The students can then spend time interacting with exhibits to see what they notice.

You may want your students to document their explorations so they can share their experiences when you return to your classroom. Documentation could include the Kiewit Luminarium Scavenger Hunt Worksheet, students sketching, counting, timing, and/or measuring what happens during their investigations, students taking photos or videos, or creative ways you decide to document the experience.

Possible Scavenger Hunt Themes:

- Search for patterns
- Explore pendulums
- Investigate shadows
- Create images of yourself
- Locate spinning things
- Test your physical abilities
- Test your mental abilities
- Find exhibits that require you to use more than your hands
- See something that isn't really there
- Use your body as a conductor
- Make or manipulate colors
